Message from the Head of School:

This week we had a visit from our Link Learning Disabilities Nurse, Helen Watts. For those of you who are familiar with the service, Helen took over from Ann Poll. I know that the LD nursing team has a long waiting list and also that we have many students who cannot access this service as they do not have a diagnosis of learning disability. These visits are invaluable to have questions answered by an expert when the service can be difficult to access by many families. This was the first visit, and we had some useful feedback as to how this could be run next time.

On Tuesday we had a visit from a local author, Phillip Kavadias, who talked to some of our students about writing and introduced us to his book Mission Microraptor. The students suggested ideas for his next book, such as choosing a setting from a choice of four, the shape of the spaceship. This really sparked ideas for one of our students who suggested ideas which he could use for another half a dozen books!
