SCHOOL MEAL ORDERING FOR NEXT HALF TERM:

The Arbor school meals ordering window is **OPEN** to order all school meals for the next half term (Thursday 3rd September to Friday 23rd October 2026)

Please access your school meals via the Arbor App or the online Arbor Portal to order your meal choice for your child's school meals. The menu is available from our website - click [here](#) to view.

Please ensure you select a meal for each date that it is required. If a school meal is not ordered, this means we will be expecting a home supplied packed lunch for that day.

You can choose any meal for any day - **A reminder that the meat used in our meals is not kosher or halal**

Payment of £3.00 per meal is to be paid via the Arbor App or Portal

Please note that the changes to Free School Meals eligibility will be live from September 2026.

The meal ordering window for next half term WILL CLOSE AT 10AM ON MONDAY 6th JULY.

If you do not order school meals for your child/ren, please ensure they bring in a HOME SUPPLIED packed lunch on each day.

Please ensure any communication regarding school lunches is via Arbor or the school office. This should not be done via the home-school diaries.

Notice of Blackgrove Road and Aylesbury Road traffic management

We are doing a water main connection and association testing, general verge works and reinstatement.

Location:

Blackgrove Road and Aylesbury Road (between Waddesdon Hill junction and A41 roundabout) Waddesdon

Duration:

3 days Monday 6th July to Tuesday 7th July and Friday 17th July

What to expect:

Blackgrove Road - lane closure with 2-way temporary traffic lights, operating 8:30am to 5:30pm on each day

Aylesbury Road - lane closure with 3-way temporary traffic lights, operating 8:30am to 5:30pm on each day. The footway will be closed during the works, with no pedestrian access available.
