### TURING CLASS

What a year it's been in Turing Class! Our students dived into every celebration with enthusiasm – joining the Christmas Fete festivities, immersing themselves in music and movement at Vache Baroque, and spotting garden birds during the Big Garden Bird Watch. Learning stayed hands-on throughout: exploring numbers with practical props, following clues on our "Let's Go on a Hunt" topic, losing themselves in story time, and discovering through cooking and sensory play that brought each lesson to life through touch, sound and movement. This summer, our focus turned to communication and confidence, passing and catching in PE, exploring time and the days of the week, animal and transport sounds in phonics, and expressive whole-body mark-making to music. We made the most of the sunshine too, with Basquiat-inspired outdoor art, water play exploring capacity, and stories read in the shade. A real highlight has been preparing for life in the community, practising getting on and off the minibus and travelling around Aylesbury, which our students have taken on brilliantly. Across the whole year, Turing Class has shown wonderful teamwork, growing independence, and genuine joy in learning. We couldn't be prouder of all they've achieved.

## PLANNED ROAD WORKS IN AYLESBURY

**HS2 Works Notification: Notice of daytime road closure, Ellesborough Road, Wendover**

We will be cutting back overgrown vegetation, including hedges and weeds. This is to enable the installation of a low voltage cable on Ellesborough Road as part of the reinstatement of the road. A water pressure test will also be carried out on the existing Ellesborough Road. Please see the key information relating to these works:

### Location

Ellesborough Road, Wendover, Buckinghamshire

### Duration

Monday 20 July (9:30am – 3:30pm) & Tuesday 21 July (9:30am – 3:30pm)

### What to expect

- Day time closure of Ellesborough Road over two days.
- A diversion route to be signposted.
- Some noise from the works is expected.

We are installing parapets on the Rocky Lane bridge. To enable these works, a road closure of Rocky Lane is required to install the parapets safely. Please see the key information relating to these works:
